COMMUNITY SPEED WATCH

The Parish Council has received several complaints regarding speeding through our village. This, coupled with the potential increase in traffic through the village due to developments, either in the village or Hunstanton, has led us to make enquiries regarding the setting up of a Community Speedwatch team.

At this point we would emphasise that this would not be run by the Parish Council, although perhaps some councillors may wish to become volunteers. The team would be independent of the Parish Council and have its own co-ordinator.

There are currently 70 such teams across Norfolk, including Thornham, Bircham and Great Massingham with between 600 and 700 volunteers.

Typically, volunteers give up an hour of their time each week, or less frequently depending upon how many volunteers are in the team. The team is led by a co-ordinator who will organise where and when the team will go out.

The co-ordinator will be responsible also for storing the equipment and needs to be computer literate as the returns are forwarded electronically to the administrator.

The number of possible sites will depend upon the size and layout of the village and will be selected in conjunction with the Speed Watch administrator. Three volunteers are required each time. The setting up of a team is in 3 stages:-

- (1) Volunteers complete application forms and send off to the administrator via the co-ordinator. At least six volunteers are needed, including the co-ordinator, although there can be more.
- (2) On receipt of the application forms the administrator will arrange to meet with the co-ordinator to discuss which sites on either 30 mph or 40 mph roads are suitable.
- (3) Initial training is for a minimum of six volunteers and will take place on a Monday to Friday, either morning or afternoon, and on very rare occasions a Saturday. The co-ordinator must provide more than 1 possible date for training and needs to book a suitable venue which will accommodate the team plus 3 other people. At the end of the training the volunteers will be asked to sign an agreement in duplicate.

Leaflets which explain in more detail about the scheme, how to set up a team and how it operates, for anyone who is interested in learning more, together with Application forms, can be picked up from the Parish Council office in Pound Lane. We hope that volunteers will come forward to take part in this scheme and help to make the roads through our village safer.

This month there is good news and sad news from the fire station. News of a new arrival but also of a departure.

The good news starts with firefighter Leesa Espley who at the end of May, passed the last of the assessments needed to be an incident commander. Long gone are the days when we would go to shouts with whoever had served the longest in charge if a junior officer was not available. Nowadays, there are various courses and assessments to complete as you might expect for a position of such responsibility. The fact that Leesa took on the challenge and succeeded is great for the station but, not being one to rest on her laurels, she followed it up with promotion to crew manager in June. Well done Leesa!

We had more good news in June when Will Guy joined the station, also as a crew manager. Will has been a firefighter at Hunstanton since 2005 and before that, he was a member of the fire cadet unit based there. He may have fire-fighting in the blood as his father, Martyn, was a fireman here in Heacham from 1975 to 1984.

We are very pleased to welcome Will to the station and also to congratulate him on his promotion.

Well that's the good news, now for the sad news which is that our longest serving firefighter, Philip Garwood, has decided to hang up his tunic for the last time at the end of this month. Philip joined the station on 23rd July 1987 and so will have completed 29 years' service when he leaves. His experience and humour will be missed by the crew, but we wish him well and thank him for his commitment over such a long period of time.

So, as we say hello to a new crew member and cheerio to another, the need for recruits remains the same. The station should have a watch manager, two crew managers and nine firefighters. The recent appointments have helped but we still need FIVE more firefighters to be at full strength. If you think you could be one of them, please come and see us.

CHURCHES TOGETHER IN HEACHAM

? DECISION TIME ?

Stay or leave? That was the question! By the time we read this, we shall know how we chose to vote on June 23rd. It wasn't an easy or straightforward option, with strong arguments on both sides and question marks over the truth. Sadly, there was, as far as I can be sure, no reference to God and His will. But He is in control of history – it is HIS-STORY and His purpose will be fulfilled (Psalm 33 verses 10-12). And we are being carried along with all that is unfolding in the world, so are we helpless pawns?

No! We have a vital choice to make; it's the greatest decision we shall ever come to. It concerns eternity: where are we going to spend it? Our Saviour, Creator Lord, has opened up the right way to be safe for ever, if we choose to entrust Him with our lives now.

Two kittens who were "tipped out" on my Farm illustrate this. Unknown to me at the time, a neighbouring farmer had shot their mother on my land. The tiny mites, 3-4 months old, had run in terror along a ¼ mile hedge to reach the house and garden. My dog alerted me of their arrival and I duly trapped and rescued the first, a tom, and then five weeks later, his sister: identical fluffy tabbies. The tom, despite being safe indoors, had refused to trust me and once his sister joined him he wanted out and fled to one of my barns. Two days after being trapped and rescued, Sissy made a very different choice. She immediately tamed down, enjoying the food, play and fuss; an amazing contrast, and a very wise move. For ten years now she has had a full life with me on the Farm, and has lived in safety. Her brother soon disappeared and I could only guess about his future.

Sissy's choice has affected her present life, but our decision now will stay with us forever. There is a forever home awaiting us with our Forever Friend, but the choice is ours.....which "box" will get our X ?

Thanks to Kaa for coming to help on the day; the Cubs that came on the trip got a copy of the photos we had taken of them, a bookmark and pencil.



Heacham at Night

On 4th July at 5.24pm we are as far from the Sun as we get, 94.5 million miles. Just before Christmas we will be about 2 million miles closer.

The nights are getting a tad longer but the planets easily visible - Mars, Saturn, Jupiter - are the same as last month and all are fading over time.

Look SSW for Mars and Saturn. Just over a two storey roof height from a typical back garden. Mars looks bright and red; to the left of Mars by a couple of hands widths is Saturn which is much dimmer and yellowish. The red star Antares is still close by the two planets and the three form a right angled triangle in the middle of the month. Between the 14th and the 16th at 11pm, the gibbous Moon will be just above the triangle, close to Mars on the 14th, Saturn on the 15th.

The first weekend of June was fairly clear and I saw the planets well. Mars was so bright I saw dark markings on its surface through the eyepiece of my telescope but not the polar caps. I didn't bother trying to get a long exposure photograph as there was haze which made Mars look like a brake light in fog. However, Saturn's rings were very obvious so I tried just sticking the lens of my 'phone on top of the telescope eyepiece. Here is the result.



Jupiter remains a bright object in the WSW to W. Remember the four Galilean moons, Europa, Callisto, Ganymede and Io. Use good, tripod mounted, binoculars and try finding their sparks strung out to the side of Jupiter. And Google NASA's Juno mission because the spacecraft goes into orbit around the giant planet on July 4th, almost 5 years since it was launched.

Juno is just the second craft to orbit Jupiter after the Galileo probe which ended its very successful mission in 2003. Juno will go into polar orbit and has hardened electrical systems to enable them to withstand the very strong magnetic and radiation fields produced by energetic Jupiter. Juno is also the first very deep space craft run by NASA to rely on solar cells for power. NASA generally favours using the heat generated by radio isotopes to make electricity because no deployment of large solar 'sails' is then necessary. It remains to be seen if their use of the 'European Model' is successful (the European Space Agency always uses solar panels but most of their missions have been to closer destinations).

Neptune is, theoretically, a binocular visible blue-green dot low in the SSE but I wouldn't strain your eyes. I will try and see it with an 8inch telescope and report next month. Both Uranus and Neptune will be brighter in the autumn.

Look right above your heads (11pm at night) and find a triangle of bright stars; Vega more or less straight up, Deneb a little to

the NE, Altair to the SE. This is the Summer Triangle, an asterism (a pattern of stars within a constellation) popularised by Sir Patrick Moore in the 1950's. He died over 4 years ago and seems to have vanished as old episodes of 'The Sky at Night' are only remembered by old men like me.

Due south is the constellation of Sagittarius. If the night is clear and the afternoon haze has gone, scan the area to the left of Saturn and Mars with binoculars. Any misty patches you now see will be nebulae – clouds of gas illuminated by stars forming inside them. The lowest fuzz is the Lagoon Nebula, the one close above is the Trifid Nebula, then comes a cluster of stars, M24, and finally, on top of that, the Omega Nebula. The following Hubble image, just released by NASA, shows a star forming in a nebula. It hasn't started nuclear fusion yet and is heated by gravitational compression of gases. The clouds are gas and dust swirling around it. Some of this will likely form planets.

Meteors; there are no really good showers due until mid-August, but look in the last week of this month for the delta Aquarids and the alpha Capricornids. There may not be many meteors/hour but some could be bright and the Moon does not interfere.



It is about 250 million miles past Pluto, three and a half billion miles from us, and still sending back information gathered a year ago. It is on track to pass a Kuiper Belt object on 1st January 2019.

Heacham. I will try again when the nights are dark but Pluto is very low down in the south so I will need some luck.

I wonder if the night sky in July will cover a Great Britain where the EU flag no longer has to fly? (It is 13th June as I write this).

Heacham History Group

At the May meeting, professional historian and author Gill Blanchard gave us a very informative and comprehensive talk on how to trace the history of a house and where to find the records. Starting with census returns to find out who used to live in a house, Gill led us through the 1939 register, parish records, electoral rolls, maps, tax records, trade and street directories, wartime farm surveys, enclosure awards, tithe records and even the Domesday book if you were very lucky.

For me, the highlight was finding out that railway plans included maps with details of who owned the properties adjoining the proposed route. I'm now looking forward to visiting the Norfolk Record Office to find out more about my grandfather's house. Gill also gave us a brief look at the work she did for "Who Do You Think You Are", when she traced the location of the houses that Mary Berry's ancestors lived in in Norwich. It was amusing to hear what was cut out of the programme, including a house that was now a garage (not attractive enough for the programme makers!). Luckily, Gill also managed to find the house of one of Mary's baking ancestors, which was much more picturesque. Gill will be running an internet course on Writing your Family History, starting in September. For details, ask me at the next meeting.

The May meeting also introduced a constitution for the group, with a committee and a membership. We can now apply for grants and other forms of funding. You don't have to be a member to come to the talks, but admission will now be £2 for members and £3 if you're not a member. The membership fee has been set at £2 a year, which represents really good value. We

had a good many people join at the first meeting. If you weren't there, membership forms will be available at the next meeting or you can ring me.

Our July talk is by Richard Adderson, who will be talking about the King's Lynn to Hunstanton Railway, including the Heacham to Wells Branch Line. I'm looking forward to hearing about the Royal connection, the journey my mother used to take to school in King's Lynn, and the trains that collected the grain from Miln Marsters in Docking where I used to work. It was a shame that we lost our railway many years ago.

The meeting will be on Monday, 25th July at the Old Friends Hall, Sunnyside Close, Heacham PE31 7DX. Everyone is welcome. Admission £3 (Members £2).



HEACHAM OFFICIAL GUIDE Circa 1927 (Part 2)

HEACHAM SOCIAL CLUB, PUBLIC HALL AND GROUNDS.

A possession of which the village must ever be proud is the Heacham Club Charity, embracing the Heacham Social Club, Public Hall and Grounds.

This owes its inception to the initiative of the late Mr Holcombe Ingleby, who in 1884, came to reside with his parents at Heacham Hall, and two years later married Harriet Jane, second daughter of the late C F Neville-Rolfe, of Heacham Hall, and sister of the late Mr Eustace Neville-Rolfe, who was then owner of both the Heacham Hall Estate and the adjoining Sedgeford Hall Estate, but who lived at Naples where he interested himself in the Naples Museum and became later Consul General. Mr Ingleby early saw the dire need of a Public Hall which could be used for entertainments and other functions, and in 1896 with characteristic public spirit floated the Heacham Public Hall Company. Shares were issued to the value of £600 and the remainder of the capital required obtained on mortgage. The Hall was opened the same year.

Not many years thence the late Mr Holcombe Ingleby acquired the ownership of the Heacham and Sedgeford properties, formerly owned by Mr Eustace Neville-Rolfe and subsequently sold the Heacham portion to the present owner Mr C E Strachan, Mr Ingleby transferring his residence from Heacham Hall to Sedgeford Hall, where he died in August, 1926. Mr Strachan, consistent with the public spirit and large hearted generosity characteristic of his nature, desired to continue and enlarge upon the good work started Mr Ingleby. The Public Hall

Company had never been a financial success so far as the Shareholders were concerned, and Mr Strachan, after the Shareholder subscribers had agreed to surrender their Shares and the Heacham Public Hall Company had been voluntarily wound up, paid off the Mortgage on the Public Hall and purchased an adjoining field of eleven acres. This he laid out with six tennis courts, a bowling green, cricket pitch and rifle range, and built upon a remaining portion a Social Club - containing two billiard tables and a reading room, together with a cottage for a resident steward. This was formally opened in 1913 and the first steward was an ex-bandsman of the Royal Navy. On the outbreak of the great war in August, 1914 the steward rejoined the service, the Recreation Ground by order of those in authority was ploughed up for corn-growing, and the Public Hall was commandeered for military purposes, being at one time the Brigade Hospital of the Highland Mounted Brigade.

Since the war the Recreation Ground and Public Hall have reverted to the original uses for which intended by their donor, and are now the centre of the village recreative life. Recently the Hall has been enlarged (1926) Mr Strachan bearing the entire cost and a hard tennis court added in the Autumn of 1926 and opened on February 26th, 1927, by Lord Fermoy, the local M.P. A cinema is now held in the Public Hall on Friday night of each week.

The whole of the property is vested under a Deed of Trust, with the Charity Commissioners and is known as the "Heacham Club Charity". There are four official Trustees and one unofficial Trustee. The four official Trustees are:-

1. The owner of Heacham Hall
 2. The Vicar of Heacham
 3. The Chairman for the time being of the Heacham Parish Council or any public body superseding the Parish Council
 4. The Master of Gonville and Caius College, Cambridge, who it may incidentally remarked receives as a perquisite of his office on appointment a residence at Heacham known as "The Lodge", in which it is understood he must reside for three months in the year, together with the rents of some of the lands in Heacham belonging to the same College.
 5. Unofficial Trustee (to hold office for five years).
- The first unofficial Trustee was the late Mr Holcombe Ingleby, on whose death the vacancy was filled by the appointment of his nephew (Captain Arthur Neville-Rolfe) on the co-option of the official Trustees.

Everyone knows that the population of the country is getting older, and if you live here you're probably going to know that Norfolk has the highest percentage of elderly people in the country.

If you're a keen gardener, or even if you just like spending time in the garden and watching someone else do all the hard work, then this is not news to you, you're already reaping all the benefits that a garden has to offer.

But if not, if you haven't got around to creating a vibrant statement or a tranquil haven in your outside space, then here's a taste of what it might be like in your garden with just a little effort; it's July and the perennial border has really come alive; the vivid rose-purple velvet flowers of *Agrostemma coronaria*; *Atrosanguinea* are looking positively regal against the silverygrey felted leaves and *Pulsatilla rubra*, a clump-forming perennial producing bellshaped dusky red flowers, would put the most lustrous ruby to shame.

Waves of silver and gold grass like *Stipa capillata* 'Bridal Veil' create a soft motion canvas for all this rich colour as they sigh the soft song of the sand dunes.

Later on in summer and autumn, *Achillea millefolium* 'Cerise Queen' produce clusters of deep pink flowers. If you want a cushion fit for a queen's crown in your herbaceous border then this is the one for you.

Dianthus plumarius 'Sweetness' flowering from July to September produce heavily scented pinks, ideal for cottage or perennial borders. Easy to maintain and the clove-like tasting petals are edible and suitable for soups, salads and sauces so you can eat your garden too! These are just a few of the plants that thrill me every morning when I open up at Green & Pleasant Garden Nursery at Drove Orchards in Thornham and every morning as I start work I can't quite believe that I'm being paid to do this.

A GENERAL GUIDE

The Parish Council is made up of 17 elected unpaid members who all live in Heacham and represent the village on various matters. It is the third tier of local government, the other two being the Norfolk County Council and the Borough Council of King's Lynn and West Norfolk.

We discuss a variety of issues which affect the community. The public is very welcome to attend all our meetings whether Full Council or one of our committees. We encourage comments to be made during the 15 minute Parishioners' Questions session before the start of Full Council meetings which are usually held on the 3rd Tuesday of each month at 7.30pm in the Parish Council Office, Pound Lane.

We are responsible for the upkeep of various village amenities including:

- The Parish Office
- The Old Friends' Hall
- The Library
- The village War Memorial
- The Recreation Field
- The Saltings behind North Beach
- The Chalk Pit
- Bray's Pit
- The allotments
- Some seating in the village
- Dog fouling bins
- Footpath Lighting

The Council makes comments on all **planning applications** and, although the Borough Council makes the final decision, they take the Parish Council's views into account.

The Council works with other principal authorities and can report issues such as flooding, planning concerns, overgrown trees, footpaths, drainage, roads, street signage, and speeding to the relevant authority on your behalf.

Q1: At which meetings may I speak?

All monthly meetings of the Full Council will give an opportunity for members of the public to speak.

Q2: How will I know when to speak?

The Chairman will allocate 15 minutes before the start of the meeting for public questions and comments.

Q3: Are there items I may not discuss?

Matters that are confidential or commercially sensitive may not be addressed in public.

Q4: How do I know what is on the agenda?

The agenda is published on the Council's notice board and a copy will be available at the meeting.

Q5: How do I arrange to speak? It is preferred that you contact the Clerk prior to the meeting, or raise your hand when the Chairman invites the public to speak.

Q6: What should I say?

The Council prefers you to identify yourself and to state your concern briefly and clearly.

Q7: For how long may I speak? The council prefers that you keep your questions and comments as brief and to the point as possible. At the discretion of the Chairman you may be allowed slightly longer but only in exceptional circumstances.

Q8: May several people present a comment together?

Yes.

Q9: May I raise an issue that is not on the agenda?

Yes.

Q10: Can I provide written information?

Yes, material of this sort must be given to the Clerk well before the meeting for circulation.

Q11: Will the Council respond to my concerns?

Yes, on a case by case basis.

Q12: When will a decision be made?

There is no given timescale for decisions but please feel free to contact the Clerk sometime after the meeting if you wish to have an update.

Q13: Am I allowed to film, photograph or record parish council meetings?

Yes. The law changed in August 2014 and you are now permitted to do so. It is preferred that you inform the Clerk prior to the start of the meeting.

If an item is not on the agenda no decision can be made at that meeting. The Council may not be able to respond to your question immediately, perhaps some additional research is required, so please leave us with your contact details.

Parish Council Chairman's Annual Report

Last year started with the Election of Councillors which takes place every four years. Unfortunately, again, there were insufficient candidates for a Poll to be necessary and so all existing councillors who wished to remain on the council were elected. During the year, vacancies occurred and we were fortunate enough that these were filled by co-option by Robert Pritchard and Margaret Gilbert.

I would like to thank my fellow councillors for all their support, efforts, expertise and participation, not only at our meetings but also as part of the work parties which are held at various times throughout the year. Without such people willing to give up a lot of their valuable time there would not be a Parish Council. Being such a large village – perhaps the largest in the country with over 4,000 inhabitants – the council has several committees which meet on a monthly basis so councillors may be at meetings two and even three times a month. I think we must therefore say thank you to their families also.

A big thank you must go to our clerk, Lynne Butters, who has been with us now for nearly 18 months, for all her hard work, her assistant Liz in the office and our two Parish Maintenance officers who are out and about in all weathers keeping our village up to the standard which we have come to expect and of which we can be proud.

One of the biggest achievements during the course of the past year was the saving of the village Fire Station from closure. This could not have been done without the very hard work and determination of Councillor Tracey Swann and the firemen.

We as a council continue to take an active part in the Wash East Coast Management Strategy forum which was set up a few years ago to seek ways of maintaining our flood defences and meets two or three times a year. Those of you who will remember, as I do, the disaster of 1953 will know how vital it is that our sea defences are maintained and improved, especially if all we hear about Global warming is true.

You will all be aware no doubt that we own several sites around the village. The maintenance of three of these is overseen by the Natural Environment Committee – the Saltings; Brays Pit and the Chalk Pit. I am sure that everyone will agree with me that all the effort which has been put into the maintenance of the Saltings and Brays Pit over the past few years has certainly paid off. We finally have the sign up at the seaward entrance to Saltings to explain to visitors what it is all about, and this is well worth a visit for those of you who have never been. Brays Pit is now looking a picture with the recent dredging, hopefully to improve the water level in summer; the cutting back of trees to

improve the views and the planting of daffodils. Again, none of this would have happened without the dedication of your councillors and other volunteers. We must also be grateful for those who give up their time to assist in running our village library. We are fortunate to be able to have our own library and so escape the cuts which have been imposed elsewhere in the country.

We have two major projects ongoing at the moment. The Community Building Project on the site of the former Dairy building and the installation of replacement street lighting. These are taking up a tremendous amount of time for those involved and thanks must go to Councillor Terry Clay and his committee for the former and Councillor Roger Drinkwater and the Lighting and Watching committee for the latter. We are sure that once these are both completed the village will see the benefits of all their hard work – no pun intended!!

Speaking of the Lighting and Watching committee, which is also initially responsible for looking at planning applications in the village, brings me to mention Lidl's.

Some have asked why the Parish Council has opposed this application when many in the village are in favour. This decision was made so that we would be able to have some say in the access to and from the site, the appearance of the building and also to be able to monitor that the developers comply with the various conditions imposed on them for such things as drainage. As you will know, the decision on whether to approve the development or not has been deferred by the Borough Planning committee until their next meeting in June in order to allow or enforce Norfolk County Council Highways to put in an appearance to justify their comments or lack of them. We on the Parish Council have little faith in some of the decisions made by Highways as has been witnessed by some of the other development plans in the village. Our main role is not necessarily always one of opposition but to ensure that any development is controlled in a way which benefits the village and the existing residents.

Finally, I would like to say thank you to the people who attended the Annual Parish Meeting on Wednesday 25th May. This was another disappointing turnout with only just over 20 people which, considering the total population of our village is over 4500, represents only 0.5%. Do we take this to mean that everyone is happy with what the Parish Council is doing or just an indicator that apathy is alive and well in Heacham?

I would like to remind everyone that our meetings are open for members of the public to attend and that we would welcome seeing more of you at them.

PARISH COUNCIL MEETINGS IN BRIEF

Silica Sand Review: Norfolk County Council is consulting on possible sites for silica sand extraction. One of the proposed sites is at Snettisham. A community action group opposing the use of the site has been set up, this is Wash Against Silica Pit (WASP) and Stuart Dark, co-ordinator of the group, came to speak to the Parish Council to outline why the group was against mining at this site. Mr Dark explained potential threats to health, damage to wildlife, the environment, businesses and tourism as well as the impact on highways, road safety and the wider community. Heacham Parish Council agreed to support WASP and its actions and has made representation to NCC objecting to the listing of this area as one of the possible sites for silica sand extraction.

Vacancy: The Council noted the resignation of John Stares as a Parish Councillor. The Chairman had written thanking him for his presence on the Council over the last seven years. Notice of the casual vacancy had been published and in the absence of any request for an election the Council will fill the vacancy by co-option. Anyone interested in serving as a Parish Councillor should contact the Parish Council Office for more details.

Annual Parish Meeting: The APM had been held on 25 May. Parishioners had raised the problems of buses having difficulty passing each other at pinch points on Staithe Road and Poplar Avenue, and the poor state of the Borough Council maintained verges around the village. It was noted that only a small proportion of parishioners attended the meeting and it was agreed to look at the format of the meeting in an effort to attract more.

The next Full Council meeting will be held on Tuesday 19 July at 7.30pm at the Parish Council Office.
