
When booking your appointment can we ask you to call 01485 572769 **AFTER 11.00am** to avoid the busiest time of day.

To qualify for a Flu Vaccination you will need to fall into the following category:

YOU ARE OVER 65, <u>OR</u> SUFFER FROM:ASTHMA/BREATHING PROBLEMS,
CYSTIC FIBROSIS, HEART DISEASE,
DIABETES, KIDNEY DISEASE
WEAK IMMUNE SYSTEM, LIVER DISEASE,
NEUROLOGICAL DISEASE
CARERS WHO LOOK AFTER PHYSICALLY
DISABLED, OR A DEPENDENT PERSON,
PREGNANT.

For children who qualify for flu jab and as a reminder to parents, if you are unable to bring your child on the day, but another family member attends on your behalf, we will require written consent from you to enable our staff to proceed with the flu jab.



date. In addition to our regular members we also had a number of holidaymakers and visitors who were keen to hear railway enthusiast Richard Adderson talk about the West Norfolk railway. They were not disappointed. Richard first told us some of the history of the line and then took us on a journey by train from King's Lynn to Hunstanton stopping along the way to view the signal boxes and stations. Pictures ranged from the early years of the line, right up to the closure in 1969 and even to the present day. It is amazing how much can still be seen today; many structures are still standing, some restored, and the disused lines can still be seen in aerial photos.

He then took us back to Heacham and traced the branch line to Wells, through Sedgeford, Docking, Stanhoe, Burnham and Holkham. One poignant picture was of the last passenger train from Heacham to Wells in 1952, with a wreath on the engine. The freight on the line continued until 1964.

The next meeting will be on Monday 26th September and by popular request, Claire Bradshaw of the Norfolk Archaeological Unit at Gressenhall, will be returning to give her promised Part 2 of "The Archaeology of Heacham", this time from "Mediaeval to Modern".

As usual the talk will be at 7.30pm at the Old Friends Hall, Sunnyside Close, Heacham PE31 7DX. Everyone is welcome. Admission £3 (Members £2).

#### The Old Railway Line

#### (King's Lynn -Hunstanton and Heacham - Wells-next-the-Sea)

As you all know, a very popular discussion is often about the old railway line from King's Lynn to Hunstanton.

On Monday 25th July at 7:30pm, the 'Heacham History Group' had a talk about the Old Railway Line from King's Lynn to Hunstanton including the Heacham to Wells branch line held by Richard Adderson at the Old Friends Hall.

I myself attended the talk and viewed Richard Adderson's slideshow of photos of the old railway stations around the area,

particularly Heacham and listened to what he had to say about the history of both the railway lines and the key dates to go with the facts.

The King's Lynn to Hunstanton railway line opened in 1862 and the Heacham to Wells branch line opened in 1866. Heacham railway station was part of the King's Lynn to Hunstanton line and the Heacham to Wells branch line and many people remember it to this day.

The branch line from King's Lynn to Hunstanton left from King's Lynn station and stopped at: North Wootton, Wolferton, Dersingham, Snettisham, Heacham and Hunstanton and the Heacham to Wells line left from Heacham Station and stopped at: Sedgeford, Docking, Stanhoe, Burnham Market, Holkham and Wells-next-the-sea.

Heacham Station was part of the Lynn and Hunstanton Railway and the Great Eastern Railway. Heacham Station was built to cater for the seaside village and its consistent population increase.

The trains ran beside the seashore to Heacham and gave a scenic view to the passengers on board the train. By the 1930s, Heacham had become extremely popular and the pub, which is currently still standing next to the train station, was built and known at the time as the West Norfolk Hotel. This hotel was originally built for the holiday trade, but is now a public house. Heacham station continued to improve their station to deal with the increase in the number of passengers boarding at Heacham station until its closure.

As well as the West Norfolk being built, the Hunstanton Railway Station had a hotel of its own, known as the Sandringham Hotel. It was opened by the GER in 1899 and pulled down in 1967.

Now we all know the concrete facts about our old railway lines and train stations, but nothing can beat information from someone who worked at one of the stations and has their own stories to tell.



For instance, Doug Shorten, ex-employee at Heacham Railway Station. I interviewed Doug Shorten and he told me that a wicker basket containing pigeons with leg tags was brought to the station at a certain time, roughly about 12 noon every day. The station porter would then go onto the platform and let them out of their baskets so that the pigeons could return home; this of course would be recorded.

The Heacham Stationmaster was a man called Mr Thompson; he was also in charge of the Snettisham Station because they had no station master themselves.

Eventually, after the two branch lines ran for many years, the Heacham to Wells branch line closed in 1964 and the King Lynn to Hunstanton line closed in 1969.

Sunny smiles and a big hello to you .... Who can resist smiling when the weather is as glorious as it should be in August?! And it is. The sky is blue, there are a few whispy clouds. I am lying on my sun lounger on the beach in front of Flip Flop just gazing upwards and watching the gulls high in the sky above my head.

There are a lot of them up there and they too are in their element, climbing high, their wings flapping strongly and quickly, their bodies light grey and white against a light blue sky, then soaring through the heavenly sky, their bodies glistening silver in the sun's rays. Gliding and swerving around each other with expert finesse; creating a wonderful spectacle as I lie and watch them mesmerised.

Then along comes another bird, much noisier, much, much bigger..... it flies out over the wash and climbs, climbs, climbs vertically, then twists and twists as it hurtles seaward. A rumbling engine kind of sound and someone shouts "It's coming back". 



#### Heacham at Night


Welcome to September. Nights are beginning to darken early enough for some viewing and all the astronomy clubs start up again after a summer break. This is the month of the Autumnal Equinox; on the 22nd at 3.21pm the sun crosses the celestial equator - day and night are equal lengths. Then days shorten until Christmas (only about 112 shopping days to go). The image below shows the equal distribution of sunlight over the globe at an equinox. (Web image).



I hope you saw the Perseid meteors in August. I didn't as I was in the cloud enshrouded Midlands. In the early hours they put up a fine show, so I am told, with fireballs thrown in (a meteor breaking up). You have a chance of looking for more of these in the second half of September when the Southern Taurid meteor shower is about. Not many per hour but some can be bright and you do have a window which runs until the middle of November. The peak is in the first week of October. There is also the Alpha Aurigids minor shower which peaks on September 15th. An odd meteor can be seen any night of the year; these sporadic meteors are seen most often in September so get out there and look up. Value dark skies.

The Perseids were a tad more plentiful this year because they had a kick from Jupiter which disturbed them. Jupiter's gravity field is vast and has a huge influence on all things moving about in our neighbourhood.

The giant gas planet is all but out of sight this month as it is in the glare of the setting Sun and then below the horizon when it darkens. However, if you know where to look, you can spot Jupiter in a daylight sky, I did this at the beginning of last month, I set my telescope up at around 5pm and told it to find Jupiter and there it was, swimming in a blue sky. I could even see the main southern and northern dark bands. The picture below may print just as a blue rectangle but at the end of the arrow Jupiter could be seen in the daylight sky.



I repeated this daylight astronomy with Saturn and that was remarkable as the rings were clear to see whilst the Sun shone. So, when you are sitting on your garden seat or walking along the beach with the Sun above you remember that the planets and the stars are there too. Which planets and which stars depends on the time of year and time of day.

On a couple of nights when the evening sky was clear, I also viewed Saturn in the dark. The ringed planet is still visible early this month low in the SW until about 8pm. It is now to the right of Mars which is visible in the same direction until the end of the month.

Venus shines bright this month but is very close to the SW horizon at twilight. Go down to the beaches and, on the weekend this newsletter is published, you have a chance of seeing Jupiter too; it will be to the left of Venus which will be to the left of a crescent Moon.


Mercury pops into view right at the end of the month but is low down in the East before dawn, Cromer for that.





Uranus and Neptune are well placed; Neptune being at opposition (closest to us this year) on the 2nd. I mentioned these planets last month. At 9pm Uranus is in the East whilst Neptune is in the SSE, both just above rooftop height (as seen from the end of a reasonable back garden). Both are bluey-green. Uranus bluer and brighter as it is much closer to us. The latter, Herschel's planet, is visible in good mounted binoculars or a birding scope. Stellarium software which is free to download will let you find where any planet, star, or astronomical object is in the sky at any time.

If it is clear on the 15th September, from about 8.30pm set up binoculars or a telescope to watch the right edge of the almost full Moon. Look particularly carefully between 8.50 and 9.05; the blue-green dot that suddenly appears from behind the Moon is Neptune. This ice giant has the fastest storms in the Solar system driven by a core which is at 5000°C. The image below is from NASA and shows a storm on Neptune.



If it is really clear and you can get away from streetlights, look into the West just after the Sun has gone down. A very faint glow, pyramid shaped, is the Zodiacal light caused by sunlight glinting off space dust – the remains of long gone meteors and asteroids. This light can also be seen in the east before sunrise. The earth gathers up 40,000 metric tons of this dust every year, some ends up in your house gutters and a magnet will pick part of it out.

Find the dark and keep looking up.



## Re: PROPOSED DEVELOPMENT OF UP TO 133 DWELLINGS ON LAND OFF CHENEY HILL, HEACHAM – PLANNING APPLICATION REF: 16/01385/OM

Heacham Parish Council reluctantly agreed to the building of 60 houses on this site as being allocated to the village under the Local Development Framework, although strong concerns and objections were submitted at the time regarding the access which is planned to be off Cheney Hill opposite the school field entrance. (See site plan below).

The landowner – Mr Julian Kerkham – had previously met with the Parish Council to express a wish to work in conjunction with them for the benefit of the village. However, subsequently, the number of dwellings was increased to 69 and this was approved by the borough planning committee despite objections from the Parish Council. This new application, if approved, will double the number of houses on the site and thus make the access even more unsuitable and dangerous.

Heacham Parish Council has submitted objections to this new planning application for three principal reasons.

- a) The number of houses is approximately double that which was originally allocated to Heacham and deemed sustainable by the Borough Council of King's Lynn & West Norfolk.
- b) Part of the development site, if built upon, will intrude on landscape quality.
- c) Road access to and from the site is unacceptable.



#### Bereavement

After 12 years of running the Bereavement group in Heacham, Renee Smith and Barbara Fargher are retiring. I am sure that those of you who have attended the group will have appreciated all the support and help that they have given and will join me in wishing them well in their well-earned retirement.

The death of a husband, wife, daughter, son, grandchild, colleague or close friend can be shattering and is a life changing experience; life the way we know it will never be the same again. Everyone reacts differently to their grief and there is no right or wrong way to grieve. How we grieve will be influenced by many different things, our age, our personality, our cultural background, religious beliefs, our previous experiences of bereavement and our circumstances.

When someone has been bereaved they will feel denial, anger, resentment, sadness, numbness, disbelief, guilt, isolation, loss of purpose and that no one understands what they are feeling or going through. One way of helping to deal with all of these feelings is by attending a bereavement group where they will find support and the opportunity to talk about their feelings and share memories of their loved one with other people who have been bereaved. People who attend these groups may have been bereaved recently, a few months ago or some years ago. It doesn't matter when they were bereaved, grief can hit you at any time.

Death is the one sure thing in life that we know is going to happen, but we pretend that it is not going to, and because of this we have become a death denying society. When someone we know has recently been bereaved we don't always know what to say or how to react to the bereaved person, which is why it is

so important that the bereaved person has somewhere they can go and be able to talk about their loved one.

The Heacham Bereavement Group is recommencing in October and will continue to be held in St Mary's Church Hall, Heacham on the 3rd Friday of each month from 10 o'clock till 12 o'clock, the first one being Friday 21st October 2016. It will continue to be an opportunity for people to drop in for a cup of coffee, to share memories and find some support and advice. My name is Sue Spencer and I shall be taking over the group. I have been working in the Hospice movement for the last 20 years as a Specialist Nurse, the last  $3\frac{1}{2}$  at Norfolk Hospice, Tapping House.




There is a return visit of the literary project for local schools at the Princess Theatre on September 22nd with The Two Steves with room for a few parents to come along too. Details from your child's school.



### Norfolk recycling centres all set for hazardous waste amnesties

For the thirteenth year running, Norfolk's residents can get rid of unwanted toxic chemicals, safely and securely, at a series of household hazardous waste amnesties taking place at seven of Norfolk County Council's recycling centres across the county during September.

Wood preservatives, bug and weed killers, paint, thinners, varnishes and special cleaning products are among the wide range of household chemicals that will be accepted – for free – at the weekend-long events. These are products that are too dangerous to be tipped down drains and can't be put in our regular waste bins because they can damage the environment and they need to be dealt with using specialist disposal processes. The events will be taking place between 9am and 5pm at the following sites and dates:

Martin Wilby, Chairman of Norfolk County Council's Environment, Development and Transport committee, welcomed the news of the events saying: "Once again, we've lined up specialist chemists to come to seven of our recycling centres during September and help residents get rid of their unwanted household chemicals safely, without damaging the environment and for free."

"Last year, 10,000 residents came along to our amnesties and 212 tonnes of their household chemicals including 180 tonnes of unwanted paint were safely dealt with. We're expecting this year's events to be as popular as ever."

Janice Coglin-Hibbert, Waste Reduction Officer at Norfolk County Council added: "We put these events on as a convenient way for residents to get rid of household chemicals, but most of us can do more to try to reduce the amount we end up with."

"Most of the type of chemical products we use around the house and garden give good information about the amount of coverage or application we can expect to get out of them. If we spend a bit more time working out how much we actually need to buy for a specific job, we would reduce the likelihood of ending up having to store the left overs. That would mean we save money by not over-buying and also help to push down the cost to council taxpayers of having to deal with the waste."

The County Council recommends that if people are planning to bring hazardous products to an amnesty event they should:


- Keep all products in their original containers and not mix them together;





HEACHAM OFFICAL GUIDE Circ 1927 (Part 3)



#### **RECREATIONS**

The nearest golf links are at Hunstanton, four miles north. Quiet walks through green fields and pleasant leafy lanes are to be found. Heacham is not too small for housewife who wishes to shop, and not too large so as to have for children the disadvantages of the town atmosphere. It has the makings of the ideal health resort.

Visitors should see the model dairy of Messrs. Thorne and

Thursby, and the herd of clean healthy cows, and try to realise how much simpler and better it is to avoid tuberculosis by using only germ-free milk than to spend millions on sanatoria for its cure.

Another place where a welcome is sure is the Nursery Garden of Mr Chilvers, where gorgeous splashes of bright colour and delicate scents alternately delight the senses.

At Mr Callaby's farm, with its big, partly Tudor Barn, near the Village Hall, you may hire a good horse for a gallop over the sands, and if you need it, be taught to ride.

Certainly one of the cheeriest sights in Heacham is the little studio of the armless artist, Mr Edward Gosling. He will make you a local picture of the Church, or the Almshouses, or the house where you are staying, and you will never catch him with anything but a smile on his face, in spite of his terrible natural handicap. All the village honours 'Eddie' Gosling.

#### **MUNICIPAL MATTERS**

For the purposes of local government and ecclesiastical administration, the village is placed in the King's Lynn Division of the County, Smithdon Hundred, Smithdon and Brothercross Petty Sessional Division, Docking Union, Lynn County Court District, Heacham Rural Deanery, Archdeaconry of Lynn, and the Diocese of Norwich. At the present time the interests of its 2,248 inhabitants are vested in the Docking Rural District Council, to which it sends five representatives; but efforts have been, and will doubtless continue to be made, to raise the parish to the status of an Urban District.

An abundant supply of pure water is maintained by the Hunstanton Urban District Council; and adequate scavenging is undertaken by the Parochial Committee, appointed by the Docking Rural District Council. The village is not provided with gas; but if the scheme now being promulgated by the Docking

Rural District Council matures, the near future will witness electricity available for lighting and all domestic purposes.

It may be remarked that early closing is observed by some of the local tradespeople on Wednesdays and by others on Thursdays.

#### **CHARITIES**

The village is not rich in Charities; but the deserving poor derive no small benefit from the two in existence. The Coal Charity – obtained from the rent of a cottage and eight acres of land – is distributed every Christmas in the form of coal; and the Vicar, as trustee of the 'Rolfe' Charity, distributes the interest accruing from £500 invested in Government stock, every Christmas in the form of clothing tickets.

#### **GEOLOGY**

The Church and Hall stand on Lower Greensand, locally called Carr-stone. About half-way between the Church and the new lodge gates, the trench for the water pipes showed a section of the red chalk. It is seen also after rain in the lane opposite Manor Farm gates; on Red Hill at about the level of the Sanatorium; may be traced at about the same level on all the hillsides; on the top of the quarry at Snettisham; and in full section in the cliff at Hunstanton. Such detailed notice of it is worth while, because it is practically unique. A corresponding but different rock is found in the Speeton Clay, Yorks., and in Heligoland.

To the East and North of Heacham the white Lower Chalk comes to the surface, often overlaid by glacial clays. The quarry at the higher end of Ringstead Downs shows lines of flint. The centre of Heacham stands on valley gravel, which towards the station, turns to clay, yielding striated boulders of black limestone, brought by the ice from Derbyshire. The marshes are alluvial, laid down by river and sea on this clay.

The river, on approaching the sea, turns South and runs parallel with the coast for over a mile. This is due to the fact that the tide entering the Wash flows South more strongly than the ebbing tide returns North. So pebbles, etc., tend to be shifted ever more to the South. The shingle contains jet (with occasional ammonites), amber, after storms, agates and beautiful jaspers and cornelians. Flint implements are fairly common. A very fine (Solutrean?) axe was picked up from the shallow water.



#### **BOTANY**

One rightly hestitates to give the habitats of rare plants, but with its varied geology, Heacham naturally has an abundant and varied flora. Ringstead downs (chalk), the sandy beach, the fresh and salt water leads and marshes, and the heaths of Snettisham and Sandringham form a very good hunting ground for the botanist.







#### Clay Pigeon Shooting -The Wildfowlers at the Chalk Pits, Heacham

On 20th August 2016, there were Clay Pigeon shooting taster sessions and air rifle target sessions held by the Wildfowlers of

Heacham. There were two sessions during the day, the first session was between 10:00-11:30am and the second session was held between 12:00-1:30pm.

Heacham Wildfowlers is based in Heacham and they shoot between Heacham and Snettisham usually in the winter time at the marshes. In the months March to October, the Wildfowlers clay pigeon shoot at the chalk pits behind the BP garage in Heacham. The Wildfowlers group has around 100 members in the association.

Each year the group invites children for taster sessions with the Clay pigeon shooting and the air rifle targets. The team teaches children and adults to handle the guns properly when using them and teaches kids to handle guns with proper tutors. The group encourages them to join the sport because the guns are very powerful and can be very dangerous if not handled and used correctly.

As well as the group coaching children, they will also teach parents and grandparents if they would like to give the sport a try.

Joining the Wildfowlers group doesn't always depend on the age you are, it also depends on the size or height. When shooting,



the children tend to use the smaller rifles which are red-12 and the adults tend to use the yellow rifles-20.

I spoke to Stephen Wotton from the group who started shooting in the group around 30-40 years ago. He mentioned once again that two of the main ideas of this yearly event was to make sure that they teach safety when using the guns and gun handling. Stephen also mentioned that there are more girls than boys in the group. This was later proven when myself and Amba Bowley, aged 14, had a go at the clay pigeon shooting.

I myself attempted the clay pigeon shooting and the tutor explained everything thoroughly and made sure we were comfortable with everything he was showing us and the positions we had to stand in.

I also spoke to Kate Benstead from the Wildfowlers group. Kate followed her father's footsteps into getting involved with the Wildfowlers group as he has done it for a while. It seems that the Wildfowlers is a big interest in her life and she finds it very enjoyable. Kate goes out with the group roughly two or three times a month and there tends to be around 30-40 people at the chalk pits when they go clay pigeon shooting.

Once a year the group visits Springwood High School in King's Lynn and gives some of the children with special needs and other issues a chance to have a go at the sport. This is usually arranged by Paul Evans from Springwood High School. It gives the children a chance to try out something new and enjoy having a go at a new sport.

Overall the turnout for the day was very good and the weather stayed dry but extremely windy.
