Many complaints have been made and many letters of concern have been put into the Heacham Newsletter.

Application no.17/00773/FM has been registered for 30 plus camping huts; also a large 3-bedroom house, car port, stores etc. etc.

The report clearly states that many more trees will be removed to accommodate this plan.

This will be only the start! A year down the line we will see touring caravans move in, then it is mobile homes, until there are no more trees left and it is the next building plot.

There is very little woodland left in Heacham. Please don't let this one disappear and in its place another housing estate, we have enough as it is. Remember, if this is passed the next one is just around the corner!

On July 31st, I supported my little sister Jayne by having a sponsored head shave after she had been told that she would lose her hair though intensive chemo treatment for Breast Cancer. Little did I know how big this sponsor trip was going to be? With daughter Jemma's help, JUSTGIVING.COM page and had Pen and Cash paper sponsor forms printed up, realizing that not everyone is into the dot com internet way of things (I am one of those!!). It escalated from hoping to raise £1,000 for the Queen Elizabeth Chemo unit, where Jayne is cared for and treated every 3 weeks, to an enormous sum.

Came the day of the dreaded hair appointment. Yes, I was dreading it. But what is a sponsorship if it isn't going to be easy? As Annette at Images cut into that first big chunk, I don't think there was a dry eye in the salon. It was very emotional. Jayne was there to watch, along with my sister, daughters, friend, grandson and grand-daughter. When it was done, as Annette held up her mirror for me to see the back, the small audience sent up a round of applause (I did wonder why they didn't give me a standing ovation, after all I am a thespian darling. Haha!!).

In the 9 weeks of starting this I cannot thank those enough, for donating so generously accompanied with such thoughtful and kind messages. Thank you to our families, friends, acquaintances, total strangers and anonymous donations. I have received wonderful words of hope and encouragement via Royal Mail, social media, telephone calls, emails and also people in the street.

The total so far is a whopping £3,105. It is truly unbelievable! This will not cure Jayne but it will make sure she and lots of other local cancer patients are comfortable, as our wonderful NHS caring chemo staff and volunteers cure her and them.

The support has been overwhelming but no one has supported me more, whether it be a head shave, something I am making, something I am doing or some other brainwave idea, than my




Monday 18th September at 7pm - there will be a meeting upstairs in the Heacham Social Club. By all means please bring a friend. Sandwiches will be available.

God is working His purpose out

At the end of last month and the beginning of this, there were some very high tides. We don't have flood warning sirens any more to wail their warning. Social media and local radio are the main agencies which warn us when the waters of the sea are close to the top of our defences.

We had all seen on our televisions and in our newspapers the power of flood waters earlier in July when heavy rains caused flash floods and devastated areas of, first the village of Coverack in Cornwall, and then the Severn Valley. Many homes are still uninhabitable with families still trying to reorganise their lives and most are looking for someone to blame. Their apparently secure existence had been suddenly revealed to be highly precarious. Excess rain had washed away roads and reduced organised comfortable lives to soggy, smelling chaos with no water and no electricity supply. Material possessions had proved unreliable.

Insurance companies call this an "Act of God". Would God really do such a thing to stir people from their complacency and remind them of His total power over the whole world? Not in a vindictive sense, no, but he did allow these events to occur.

East Anglia is curiously blessed with little or no high ground from which heavy rainfall can drain and cause flooding. To add to the irony the Fens don't flood because they are designed for that purpose! The crops growing in the fields around us were not destroyed. Indeed they were well watered and a hot dry spell in early August allowed for a bumper harvest to be safely gathered.

When we celebrate Harvest Festival this year, as generations have done before us, we thank God for His generous provision for our food. Yes, He created those plants that are essential to our food chain. We can certainly genetically engineer them for bigger and better yields or disease resistance but we cannot create a single leaf. God created every aspect of our lives and He created mankind for a purpose. Our role is to provide companionship for God and to worship Him. Hardly surprising then that if we ignore God and deny His very existence sometimes he allows events to make us think.



BOROUGH COUNCIL REVIEW OF LOCAL PLAN – CALL FOR SITES

The Borough Council of Kings Lynn and West Norfolk have a local plan that aims to guide development in the Borough for the period up to 2026. This plan is in two parts: a Core Strategy document which provides a planning framework; and a Site Allocations and Development Management Policies document (SADMP), which complements the core strategy by providing detailed policies and allocates sites for housing development. In Heacham it details two sites, one off Cheney Hill for at least 60 dwellings, and one to the south of St Mary's Close for at least 6 dwellings. You will be aware the Parish Council and community vehemently opposed the application to increase the dwellings on the Cheney Hill site to 133 resulting in it being turned down. The full Local Plan can be viewed on the Borough Council's website at:

The Borough Council have now commenced a review of the local plan, which will bring together the core strategy and the SADMP into one document covering the period to 2036.

This process started in October/November last year with a 'call for sites and policy suggestions' consultation which offered an opportunity for developers, agents, landowners, and other interested parties or individuals to:

- promote sites located within the borough for future development
- suggest locations/areas for special policy treatment
- put forward policy suggestions

By the deadline 14 sites had been put forward for Heacham. Over the next few months these sites will be subject to a Housing & Economic Land Availability Assessment (HELAA). This is one of several technical reports that the Borough Council is required to produce to underpin the Local Plan Review.

The HELAA is a technical assessment of sites which could potentially contribute towards the future supply of housing and employment land within the Borough. As a consequence, the HELAA does not set policy, but provides background evidence on the potential of available sites.

The identification of sites in the HELAA does NOT mean that the sites will be allocated for housing, that planning permission has been given, or that the sites will be developed at this time



The outcome of the HELAA will be used by the Borough Council to identify the most suitable and sustainable sites for possible development in Heacham, which will then be included in the Draft Local Plan.

A formal consultation on the Draft Plan, including the identified potential development site, or sites for Heacham will be undertaken later this year. However as the consultation period will only be 6 weeks, the Parish Council wanted to make

residents aware of the proposals to allow time for the Parish Council to gather opinions and alternative suggestions. If you have any comments about these suggested sites, or alternative suggestions, please e-mail the Parish Clerk at Heachampc@btinternet.com. Please note we are unable to respond individually to these e-mails, but they WILL be considered and used to inform the Parish Council's response to the Borough's formal consultation later this year.







Introduction to the Heacham Neighbourhood Plan

Heacham Parish Council are in the early stages of developing a Neighbourhood Plan for the village. A Neighbourhood Plan is a plan which sets out policies in relation to the development

and use of land in the whole or any part of a particular neighbourhood area. This is a community led plan to help guide development, regeneration and conservation. After the plan has been made, it will sit alongside the Borough's Local Plan and carries the same weight in the decision-making process.

The Borough Council has a duty to assist the process by providing access to information, offering advice, making timely decisions at the formal stages and arranging and paying for the examination and referendum. This doesn't mean that the Borough Council write the plan. The government is making more funding available as the direction of travel is that the Local Plan provides strategic policies and strategic allocations. Consequently, this means that the government are really behind Neighbourhood Plans at this point in time.

There are different reasons as to why a Parish Council, Town Council or Neighbourhood Group would undertake a Neighbourhood Plan. One of the reasons is to create a community produced plan. This means that the plan is representing local issues that are not covered by the Borough's Local Plan. Secondly, the plan can create policies to address local issues that are not covered by the Borough Council's Local Plan. Thirdly, the plan becomes part of the statutory development plan for the area. As well as the reasons mentioned above, it can provide the community with greater control over development in their area, although it is important to remember it can't stop development. Lastly, Parishes with a neighbourhood

plan will receive 25% of any Community Infrastructure Levy arising from the developments in their area compared to parishes without a neighbourhood plan who will receive 15%. (Capped at £100 per dwelling).

I met with Tracy Raby to discuss what the future holds for the potential Heacham Neighbourhood Plan. She commented: "With the Localism Act 2011, came the ability for town and parish councils to carry out their own Neighbourhood Plans. By creating a Neighbourhood Plan, it brings the community together as it has to be driven by the community itself, although, the Neighbourhood Plans are coordinated by the Parish Council, Town Council or neighbourhood group. Therefore, this enables the community to voice their opinion on how they see the future of Heacham in twenty years' time, based on how it is now before any action is taken.

"If we have a Neighbourhood Plan it gives us much more say in events when areas in Heacham are up for development, in terms of what sort of development is available. This will include factors such as the size of the development area, the type of development, the buildings we have, helping to preserve the character and heritage of the village. Therefore, this will allow us to have a little bit more control on matters arising like this in the future."

The Neighbourhood Plan isn't just about housing, it is also about how the village can attract businesses, what type of businesses, transport and leisure. This will bring the community together to understand everyone's opinion and ideas on the village's future development. The plan can't change how many houses are going to be built, but the group will be able to comment on what sort, where and how they are built. They can also influence what else the community believes should be either preserved or developed in Heacham. To help with this the Heacham Parish Council are looking for five or six members to be part of the working group for the Neighbourhood Plan.

This particular plan is also a great way to get people under 50 years of age involved. This is critical because the village needs younger people who are prepared to be actively involved in the village. Also, the decisions that could be made have more of a long-term effect for them.

On Saturday 21st October, there will be a presentation on the outlines and proposals for the Neighbourhood Plan at Heacham Public Hall, open to the public. Think about ideas beforehand such as, the things you like about Heacham and what improvements could be made. This will help Heacham Parish Council create policies for the Heacham Neighbourhood Plan.

Heacham at Night

Did you see any Perseid meteors around the 12th August? I went to the North Norfolk Astronomy Association annual Perseid barbecue and enjoyed the food (excellent meat supplied by Howells) but thick clouds and a threat of rain persuaded me to leave. On return to Heacham the sky was clearer if patchy and I saw six meteors, one fat and bright, two with long trails and three with short ones. Not up to the 100 or so sightings in past years but thin cloud no doubt hid all the faint ones and this thickened just after midnight when the Moon came up.

Hedgehog aficionados: I heard one snuffling in the hedge as I was looking up for meteors. Undoubtedly scores rained down as I looked for the hog which, annoyingly, did not appear.

Last month I promised to tell you about the Great USA solar eclipse but I can't because it's on the 21st August and I am writing this on the 13th. So, hopefully, there will be something in October's edition. However, did you see the small partial eclipse of the Sun from Heacham on the 21st last? If you did please write in to the Newsletter and I will include your comments in the article.

Now to catch up with September: At precisely 21.02 pm on the 22nd autumn officially begins. It is the Autumnal Equinox when the day is 12 hours long and, consequently, so is the night. After that it gets dark earlier and earlier, hooray. If you want to avoid the day slipping away go to the southern hemisphere where spring is starting.


The ringed gas giant, Saturn, is still the planet to catch. I caught it on 10th August when the sky appeared clear after a very sunny day. However, it had rained heavily the day before so there was a lot of moisture in the air. The rings were easily visible but not sharp in the eyepiece. This month, when the sky darkens it will be found SW moving further west as the hour gets later and the month moves on. It is unmistakable as it does not glitter like a star. A telescope, including a good bird spotting scope, will bring out the rings. It will set, vanish into the western murk, about 10.30pm so no need to stay up late. Towards the end of the month, around the 24th to the 28th, Saturn is close to the fat crescent Moon.

Look at Saturn in the first half of the month and imagine the spacecraft Cassini zooming around it and between its rings. After 1.17pm on the 15th Cassini will be no more. It will have been deliberately crashed into Saturn, imaging all the way down (the date is certainly correct, the time is my calculation). Cassini has been a truly remarkable craft and is now 20+ years old, including 7 years to reach Saturn and 13 years exploring the planet, its moons and the rings. The engineers who designed, built and

controlled it should receive far more recognition than someone who kicks a ball or pouts on television.

The official reason for destroying Cassini is to avoid any possibility of the craft, with no fuel, colliding with Saturn's moons, particularly Enceladus or Titan; these may harbour primitive life. However, a craft that has been blasted with solar radiation for 20 years is undoubtedly sterile so I think the prospect of getting really close up images and data about Saturn's atmosphere outweigh keeping the craft in a distant orbit.

Anyway, look up on the 15th and wave goodbye to Cassini, one of the greatest engineering achievements of the 20th Century.






Other planets in the sky: Jupiter is still with us but moving ever further west ever earlier and it will be lost in the murk very early in the month. The spacecraft Juno is still bobbing towards and away from that planet, protecting itself from the magnetic and radiation belts which have proved to be even stronger than anticipated. Jupiter will be very low in the west as the Sun just sets

Neptune, the most distant planet is at its closest to us this year on the 5th but will remain a binocular object all month. Look SE from the middle of the month when it will be about 20 degrees above the horizon around 9pm. You are looking for a dim, bluey-green dot. You will be seeing a planet 2.7 billion miles from your eyes. Google: Neptune September 2017, for a sky map. Two pictures of Neptune follow. One is a photograph I took from Heacham, the other is provided by NASA. Which is which?

Venus is brilliant before dawn. Look due east at 6am between about the 15th and the 26th and you will see Mars and Mercury too. Mars is the red dot and swaps positions with Mercury as the month progresses. On the 16th these planets are very close. The crescent Moon joins this trio of planets on the 18th and 19th, You will need a good easterly horizon so you may have to get up a tad early to get to one.

A short article this month as time, too, is short. Just like, soon, the days will be. Hooray again.

Norfolk Village Signs was the topic for our July talk, when Mike Weatherstone took us through the beginnings, types and variety of village signs in Norfolk. He then showed a selection of village and town signs which he had spent 15 months photographing, travelling over 5,000 miles around Norfolk.



The idea for a village sign to commemorate events or show the history or people of a village, began on the royal estate at Sandringham, encouraged by Edward VII and successive monarchs and subsequently taken up by villages and towns throughout England. In Norfolk alone there are over 400 village signs. These range from the familiar large shape made from English


oak, with painted and carved items for which the village is renowned, mounted on a post, to wrought iron plaques and the more modern stone, fibreglass or plastic. In fact, one of our parish councillors in the audience was able to inform Mike that



Heacham's sign Pocahontas was made of fibreglass. Locations vary from the centre of the village, the village green, school playgrounds and at Upton and Wramplingham, in the middle of the village pond (deters vandals wonderfully). Many signs show the initials of the w.I. who were instrumental in getting a village sign made and erected. The jubilees of the W.I. were some of the occasions

celebrated on the signs, but a lot of the signs commemorate jubilees or coronations of our sovereigns from George VI's Silver Jubilee, the Queen's Coronation (Brinton Hingham and many others) to her Diamond Jubilee. I for one will certainly look at our village and town signs with renewed interest as I drive around the county.

On September 25th, Gary Rossin, one of the directors of our local "Sedgeford Historical and Archaeological Research Project" (SHARP), will be coming to talk about the dig and its story so far. In over 20 years, the project has unearthed treasures and surprises such as a horse burial, gold coins hidden in a cow



Borough Council News

The doubling of the Cheney Hill development was thrown out by the planning committee. There is a belief by many of that body that people should be listened to. The reasons for rejection are robust and correct. However, this may not stop an appeal as, in my limited experience, developers appear to rarely listen to or recognise what is correct or moral or common sense. Neither does this mean an end to large scale development proposals for Heacham; the next batch is about to be decided. At the same time, significant local effort is being made to create a Neighbourhood Plan which will aim to reflect the interests of Heacham residents and can have a significant impact on how development is managed. Look out for notices about that and get involved.

Those of you, likely young, who would like a house are sometimes critical of attempts to limit house building. The term 'affordable homes' appeals and is, as on the Archers (Radio 4), misunderstood. 'Affordable' homes have to be provided on larger housing developments, typically 20 houses on a site of 100. Most will be owned and managed by social landlords. The rent can be about 80% of market rent so it could still be a lot as market rents are far too high. Some 'affordable' houses will be used in shared ownership schemes.

Heacham will get some 'affordable' homes from the 69 houses already given permission at Cheney Hill but it does not mean anyone in Heacham will actually live in any. There is no 'local link' to affordable homes. There is a borough wide housing register and those who are homeless or disabled or living in overcrowded housing who also meet the income criteria are given priority. If no such people want to move to Heacham – after all there are few jobs and they would likely have to travel back to Lynn to get one – then, possibly, the criteria might be 'softened' but it could then mean someone from Hunstanton, for example, accessing the affordable home, not someone from Heacham.

There are houses on 'rural exception sites' which are meant for local people. Heacham has one but when it was built, so I am told, sufficient local demand did not come forward. To get a rural exception site a landowner has to offer cheap land because the houses are not worth so much as 'normal' ones – mortgage lenders don't like them as it can be difficult to sell them on. When a rural exception site was proposed recently for Old Hunstanton, the borough interpreted is as housing for Hunstanton too; that went to appeal and I think Old Hunstanton won but there are still rumblings.

Anyway, if you are young and want a place of your own, go on-line and find out how to qualify for registration and how to apply for properties which become available. But do not assume that 'affordable' houses are affordable or that you have any rights to one in the village because you live here. What are needed are council houses with realistic, controlled, rents but they are not being considered at all in this borough. And remember, to get 50 'affordable' homes around 250 houses have to be built. The 200 market houses will go to anyone with the money. The 50 'affordable' to those who best fit the current council criteria which does not include where you live. Apparently, discriminating by favouring where a person lives would fall foul of anti-discrimination laws. Feel free to complain to your MP.





Single Person Discount claims being reviewed for fraud

A review of council tax single person discount claims is underway to reduce the number of fraudulent and incorrect claims.

This regular review looks at households where council tax Single Person Discount is being claimed to check that claims are genuine, and to remove discounts where households no longer qualify, or where claims have been made fraudulently The discount is worth a 25 per cent reduction on the Council Tax bill, and fraudulent and incorrect claims directly take money away from other council services.

Customers whose discounts are correct will automatically have their details verified and the discount will continue without any need for the customer to contact the council.

Where there is a query, customers will be contacted by letter for more information. Customers are able to go to the website shown on their letter to verify their details, or can post their confirmation back to the Nottingham address shown. They should respond as quickly as possible as failure to do so may result in the Single Person Discount being removed.

If fraud is discovered, the Single Person Discount will immediately be revoked and the council will consider proceeding with prosecutions and large penalties.

Cllr Brian Long, Leader of the Borough Council of King's Lynn & West Norfolk, commented: "Nearly 30% of all households in the Borough receive the council tax Single Person Discount representing a substantial amount of money. By removing discounts from those who are making fraudulent claims and paying less than they should, the council can ensure money is available for vital services. It is not fair that other tax payers should be subsidising those that are claiming under false pretences".

The borough council uses an experienced supplier to provide a managed service to review Single Person Discount claims using credit reference data, in addition to contacting customers for further information. This approach has been successful for previous reviews.

Cllr Brian Long added: "Whilst it is crucial that we reduce fraudulent claims we would not want to put off people who are entitled to the discount, and would encourage them to apply".

Any adult in the borough who lives alone or with children under 18 may be entitled to claim the Single Person Discount. The discount is not a 'benefit' and it is not means tested so no financial information is needed. The only criteria being that there are no other adults living in the property. An application form is available on the council's website at www.west-norfolk.gov.uk/reduceyourbill or by calling 01553 616200.

PARISH COUNCIL MEETINGS IN BRIEF

Cheney Hill Development: The revised application to build a further 64 dwellings was rejected by the Borough Council planning committee on 31 July, with only two Councillors voting in favour. The Chairman of the Parish Council thanks all residents of the village who attended the meeting to object to this overdevelopment of the Cheney Hill site.
