


Maurice Feilds Studio

The Newsletter has recently received a request for information relating to a Maurice Feilds Studio in Heacham.

We have been supplied with a copy of the 'stamp' (see below) and the following correspondence. If anyone has any information about the studio please contact the Newsletter team and we will forward any items received to the enquirer who resides in Shropshire.

"I am grateful for your help in trying to locate the whereabouts of Maurice Feild's Studio, Heacham, Norfolk. The strange thing is that he died in 1988 and the studio stamp is dated 2016 on the back of several 'Life' sketches. The stamp appears on the back of a pencil figurative study apparently by a pupil in the 1970s judging by the pupils, or possibly models, signature and date. Feild was a highly respected art teacher, being himself a pupil at The Slade and for a while teaching at Camberwell School after an earlier long spell at The Downs, Colwall Prep School, where his pupils rose to very high acclaim!"



Another Recipe from The Prudent Pensioner

Oatcakes were mentioned in a programme I was watching recently, I used to really like them. There are different types, some are like a pancake but I liked the crispy ones. I decided to have a go at making some and found a recipe online. I then decided to experiment and using oats, I made some Oaty Cheese biscuits which have been very well received. This is how I made them:

Oaty Cheese Biscuits

Ingredients:

40g Butter
40g Cooking fat (I used lard)
165g Porridge oats
60g Full Flavour cheese grated
A pinch of salt
¼ teaspoon Mustard powder
Cold water (I put a cup of cold water in the fridge beforehand)
Flour for rolling out.

Method:

Turn on oven at 200C.
Put oats in a food processor and whizz for a few seconds until they resemble coarse flour, then place them in a mixing bowl. Add salt and mustard powder and mix well.

Cut butter and fat into small pieces, add to bowl and using fingers or hand blender rub/mix together until like breadcrumbs. Add grated cheese and mix well

Using a palette knife or similar, gradually add approximately 2 tablespoons of cold water, working in well until it forms a firm dough.

Transfer dough to a floured board, knead a little then roll out to a thickness of approximately 7mm and cut into preferred shape. (I cut into strips approximately 8cm x 2cm).

Place biscuits on a baking tray and bake in a pre-heated oven at 200C for approximately 20 mins, or until fairly crisp.

I love spring. Not only that it is the escape window from horrible winter, the cold, miserable, snowy days, but that it brings with it new life, sunshine, a bit of warmth, and inspires my walkabouts. Suddenly daffodils spring into life and the world looks different and indeed all that God created looks as Genesis describes it, 'and God saw that it was good.' Indeed no one can miss the beauty of the woodlands, whether you are walking or you are driving along the roads. The farmers begin to work their fields.

It reminds me of Peter Firth's poem:

Lord of this morning
Once again the world has turned us
Out of the night and into day

And once again
All the miracles of spring
Are thrusting their new life
Into my old one
And I would like to feel a part
Of this renewal
So, Lord of this new morning,
Help me.

There is a spiritual sense to the way and manner seasons change. What a coincidence that it is during spring that we celebrate important seasons in the Christian calendar. We move from the darkness of lent and passion to the morning of Resurrection and Ascension, and to the bright light of Pentecost. For a long time Easter was to me a simple event on the Christian calendar. It meant nothing more than the fact that we had more services and activities happening at the same time. It was, until I was drawn to be part of this event and I met the resurrected Christ, and my life was transformed, my sense of direction inspired. Just like the two disciples on their way to Emmaus, Christ transformed my understanding of the Easter event, my direction changed. With the help of the Holy Spirit, I felt like the early disciples, inspired to transform, the Lord of the new morning did help me.

As churches together we have enjoyed aspects of this transforming power for ourselves here in Heacham. The way we have worked together as churches is inspiring hope of new life together. Lenten sessions held between Heacham Methodist church and Heacham Parish church, were a great success. These were followed by Passion and Easter services in the same churches, and more recently Ascension on 18th May and Pentecost on 28th May.

Summer of Art

I am so excited that my concept for the Wighton 23 exhibition has been selected!

Many of you are probably familiar with the Cley summer exhibition held in July. The main venue was St. Margaret's Church. Over the years artwork was exhibited throughout the town and on the beach. In 2021, the final year at Cley, my installation piece 'Ether' was exhibited.

Run by the North Norfolk Exhibition Project (<https://nnecontemporaryart.com>) and originally located in Salthouse, the exhibition will take place at Wighton for the first time this year. It runs from Thursday 6 July – Sunday 6 August. The venue is All Saints Church and includes the churchyard and conservation area. Forty artists will be responding to the theme 'Cycle' in an exhibition curated by Rachel Allen of Mandell's Gallery in Norwich.

The conservation area is reached through a gate off the churchyard. It's like a magical entrance to an intimate space. Present are several historic gravestones and crosses. One bears the name Raymond Spencer Moore, father of Henry Moore. It's funny to have landed in a place so close to where Henry Moore spent his holidays while studying at the Royal College of Art. What a surprise to find that it was here that Henry Moore found the flint that so inspired him. It is here that my work will be.

The title of my piece is *Beginning – Ending – Beginning*. I will be making a sequence of pillar-like shapes growing out of the ground in which I will embed organic materials found on site.

On the one hand the work will be a living piece in that it will change over the month at Wighton. At the same time it's a decaying and dying piece. A paradox.

Apologies, a short article this month as I have been and, possibly, still am, very busy. It is fortunate that June is a month of light nights and viewing of the sky can be problematic even if the weather allows.

The 21st June is the Summer Solstice when the Sun is highest in the sky at noon and it is the longest day at over 16 hours. The moment the solstice happens is 3.57pm so stand still and enjoy it. After that, night time begins to lengthen until December 21st, goody.

The planets: Venus is well placed and bright again. Those of you who watched the Coronation concert will have seen Venus in the background, well above the stage. Commentators didn't seem to notice.


The Goddess of Love / Evening Star / planet will actually get brighter over the month, from magnitude -4.4 to magnitude -4.7

(new readers: the lower the number the brighter). On the 4th June, Venus is at its greatest elongation, furthest distance from the Sun as seen from Earth.

On the 13th, Venus is close to a star cluster named Praesepe or The Beehive. Binoculars will bring the stars into view. On the 21st, a Crescent Moon is to the right and a much fainter Mars, magnitude +1.6 is to the left. Look for a reddish dot.

Please read my articles in the last two issues of the Newsletter / Town and Around for details about Venus. They are available online.

Mars is around all month, setting after midnight. On the 2nd, it is in the middle of the Praesepe star cluster of 1000 stars. This 'Beehive' is in the middle of Cancer. A 'phone app will help you find it; Venus helps on the 13th (see above). There is another reddish object in the sky, the red giant star Antares. The Full Moon is just above it on the third.





“Yes, wonderful things”

These famous words are attributed to Howard Carter when he discovered Tutankhamun's tomb in the Valley of the Kings on 22nd November 1922. On Monday 12th June 2023, Lucia Gahlin will be giving an illustrated talk on **“Wonderful Things!” Tutankhamun's Tomb and Treasures**, at Sedgeford Village Hall at 2.00pm. A specialist in the archaeology of Ancient Egypt, an accredited Arts Society lecturer, and author of books including *Egypt: Gods, Myths and Religion*, her talk will explore the discovery in 1922 of this amazing tomb, its iconic treasures, and the boy king who conjures up wonderful imagery and mysterious tales of the Pharaohs. What happened to the incredible wealth of funerary goods found inside?

Ancient Egyptian art was produced by the civilisation in the Nile Valley between 5000 BCE and 300 CE in the form of painting, sculpture and architecture. The period around 3000 BCE is regarded as the Early Dynastic Period, during which art, architecture and many aspects of religion took shape and were marked as distinctive. Hieroglyphic writing, the Pyramids and other natural sculptures were created. Drawings and proportions of the human figure were developed, and the first known portraits were also completed. The tombs and monuments housed much of the surviving art where an emphasis on life and death is featured, together with the preservation of past knowledge. The ancient art was designed to represent socioeconomic status and belief systems. Permanence was a key factor - the artists' desire to preserve everything from the present as clearly and permanently as possible. Symbolism was consistently used to depict important themes, for example, law and order. The Pharaoh's regalia signified his power to maintain order. Gods, goddesses, human beings, heroic battles, animals and nature were highly symbolic figures in Egyptian art. Many of the surviving works were designed for one purpose – to provide peace and assistance to the deceased in the afterlife.

The Nile Valley played a major part in enabling Ancient Egypt to flourish and prosper. The location and regular flooding meant fertile soil, ideal for agriculture. Settlers along certain parts of the Nile Valley were able to produce surpluses of edible crops which led to the growth of the population, particularly in those parts north of Aswan where most of the population and cities lay. The cultural and historical sites of Ancient Egypt are nearly all situated along the riverbanks of the Nile Valley due to the abundance of natural resources. Art that was formed during this early Egyptian civilization was made possible due to the abundance of high-quality building stones - the quarried limestone along the Nile Valley, granite from Aswan and other resources from the wadis of the eastern desert. Deposits of gold, semi-precious and decorative stones, copper and lead ores, all contributed to make this civilization well-known for its architecture, monuments, jewels etc.

The tombs of the Pharaohs were filled with an astonishing amount of artwork, designed to speak only to the gods, the highest most elite group of visitors. Tomb art was sacred and magical because the ancient civilisation believed that art had the power to carry a person forwards, freeing them from the silent, static state of death. The purpose of the artworks was basically functional, entwined with religion and ideology. More sources of information have grown about ancient Egypt as more and more art and artifacts have been recovered from archaeological sites and experts have become able to decipher the hieroglyphics.

However, no find has been more important, or captured worldwide imagination more, than the tomb of King Tutankhamun. It is the only royal burial found completely intact in modern times and containing such fabulous treasures. The discovery has enabled Egyptologists to better understand so much about the art of this ancient civilisation, and if you would like to explore this fascinating subject, come to Lucia Gahlin's illustrated talk on Monday 12th June 2023 at 2.00pm in Sedgeford Village Hall. Visitors are very welcome.

MAKE SURE YOU CHECK YOUR TAX CODE!

Believe it or not, the Income Tax and National Insurance collected through PAYE make up approximately 40% of all tax receipts.

The Tax Code system is the mechanism for achieving this, and, if you are not in Self Assessment, the key to paying the right amount of tax as an employee, or a pensioner with an occupational pension, is having the right tax code.

PAYE is only a method of collecting tax. If the wrong amount of tax is collected, a liability, or a refund, will arise. This is one reason to understand how PAYE works and to check that the tax code that is being used by your employer, or pension provider, is the right one for you.

HM Revenue & Customs carries out a reconciliation of your tax position at the end of each tax year, and together with Self Assessment, any errors should be corrected eventually. Nevertheless, it is better to get it right at the outset.

WHAT TAX CODES MEAN:

In basic terms your PAYE Tax Code is the amount of your tax free allowance with the last digit removed, followed by a letter, e.g. someone with a full personal allowance of £12,570, and no other complicating facts, will have a tax code of 1257L. From then on, dependent upon a tax payer's circumstances, it all becomes more complicated.

The letters used are as follows:

- L Standard Personal Allowance
- M You are receiving part of your partner's personal allowance
- N You are transferring part of your personal allowance to your partner
- T Other calculations are needed
- 0T No allowance
- BR All at basic rate of income tax
- D0 All at higher rate of income tax
- D1 All at top rate of income tax
- NT No tax
- K Extra amount added to your income
- W1 Emergency code week 1
- M1 Emergency code month 1

HOW TAX CODES ARE WORKED OUT:

If you have a single source of earnings, the code will start with your personal allowance which will then be adjusted downwards for any employee benefits (e.g. car or private medical insurance). Additionally, it may be reduced if you have savings, rental profits or dividends above their respective annual allowances. There may also be increases in your coding to provide tax deduction for allowable employment expenses, personal pension contributions and higher rate relief for charitable donations or where the Marriage Allowance has been transferred to you from your spouse. These adjustments will only be made to your main PAYE source of income. Any supplementary sources will have a Basic Rate (BR), Higher Rate (D0) or Additional Rate (D1) code. K codes can be confusing but are essentially just negative codes where an amount gets added to your income for PAYE purposes e.g. where your personal allowance is abated or lost completely because you earn over £100k, or where pensioners receive the State Retirement Pensions, and have other earnings or private pensions and annuities.

Pensioners should be aware that the State Pension is taxable and is paid gross (i.e. without deduction of tax). Hence due to the recent triple lock increase of 10.1%, some pensioners will find that they have insufficient allowances to cover it and will have received lower tax codes than they expected for 2023/2024 tax year, with the additional tax liability having to be taken from their PAYE sources of income.

CHECK YOUR TAX CODE:

The 2023/2024 Notice of Coding that you will have recently received will tell you how the Revenue has worked out your code. The supplementary notes on the reverse will explain the

adjustments arising from your specific circumstances. The basics of the allowances/benefits in kind etc., will be pretty straightforward but adjustments to rate bands are not so easy to understand. If you had a prior year underpayment of up to £3k you may have asked HM Revenue & Customs to “code this in” by way of an adjustment to your code in the following year. E.g. if you owed £1k from a previous year and are a higher rate tax payer, your code would be reduced by £2.5k.

If you think your tax code is wrong you can use the HM Revenue & Customs “Check your Income Tax for the current year” online service to update your employment or pension details. (<https://www.gov.uk/check-income-tax-current-year>)

Alternatively, you can write to HM Revenue & Customs quoting your PAYE Reference/National Insurance Number/10 digit Unique Tax Reference number (if you have one).




The Parish Council continues to urge residents not to feed the ducks or geese. This is particularly important to prevent mother ducks bringing ducklings off the ponds and onto the roads.
